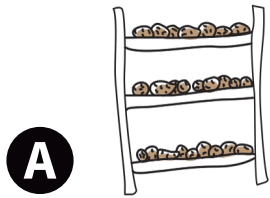


How to manage your plants upon receipt ?

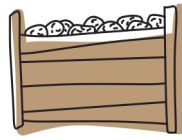
And first steps in cultivation.



A

FOR A PRE-GERMINATION

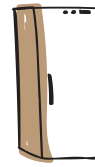
Keep on a shelf sheltered from frost, in the light, for about 2 months, depending on the ambient temperature.



B

FOR A PLANTING IN 10-15 DAYS

Stacked in crates, on a trailer, on the ground... in a dry, ventilated and frost-free space. It is imperative not to leave the plants in big bags or sacks.



C

FOR A PLANTATION IN A TIME FRAME GREATER THAN 10-15 DAYS

Storage in cold room at 6/8°C.



Target white point stage

= maximum 1 or 2 mm of germs.
Above all, do not allow germination.

Minimum temperature and maximum depth recommended during planting.

Cover with a small amount of soil for quick germination and to prevent attacks from rhizoctonia.



Otherwise, pass the **harrow** within 8 days to **reduce the volume of soil**.

Then every week until 10/15 cm of vegetation height. At the stage of 20/25 cm, carry out **the final hilling** (possible pre-hilling).

What happens if I have not reached this stage or if I have not followed these recommendations?

Sometimes, nothing. But often, if the plant is not warmed up enough or has germinated too much, and if the weather conditions are not favorable, you will have a slow or uneven emergence, or even plants that rot (remember: they are living!). The care you give to these first steps will be crucial for the future!
